PROGRAMMATIC, FISCAL, AND REPORTING ASSURANCES

The United States Department of Education (USED) has approved the application from the State of Alabama for ESSER funds under the CARES Act. The availability of funds is from 4/29/2020 to 4/29/2021. LEAs will be allowed to expend funds until 9/30/2022. Pre-award costs to the ESSER fund will be allowed for allowable cost incurred on or after March 13, 2020.

2. Allowable Service(s) Assurance

How will the LEA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19?

The Superintendent and Central Office Department Heads participated in three meetings to discuss the educational needs as a result of COVID-19. Several one-on-one meetings were held with the Federal Programs Coordinator and Department Heads to finalize the educational needs identified. Needs identified: 1.) Provide clean and sanitized facilities, 2.) Provide on-going meal services, 3.) Provide workforce computers, 4.) Provide computers to students, 5.) Provide Hot Spots, 6.) Provide Extended Day Academic Services, 7.) Provide Counseling Services for Mental Health, 8.) Provide a Registered Behavioral Technician for behavioral difficulties, 9.) Provide nurses during the summer for any health needs, 10.) Provide for Psychometrist services.

How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services?

Provide Summer Learning opportunities face-to-face and online learning. Provide Extended Day Academics four days a week at each of our four schools for the 2020-2021 school year. Provide the mental and behavioral support needed for students to be successful academically. Ensure that all students have a computer and internet access to complete online learning.

 This will be assessed by the use of Universal Screener as a baseline and on-going Formative Assessments throughout the school year.

What is the LEA's proposed timeline for providing services and assistance to students and staff?

Cleaning Supplies 3/13/2020 to 6/30/2021, Contacted Custodian Workers 8/1/2020 to 6/30/2021, Feeding Program 3/23/2020 to 8/14/2020, Workforce and Student Computers 3/13/2020-6/30/2021, Contracted Counselling Services 8/1/2020 to 6/30/2021, Registered Behavioral Technician 7/1/2020 to 6/30/2021, Nursing Services 6/6/2020 to 5/27/2021, Contracted Psychometrist 6/4/2020 to 7/20/2020, Extended Day 8/24/2020 to 5/21/2021. All funds will be expended by September 30, 2022.

How will the LEA use ESSER funds to promote remote learning?

Purchase of computers and hot spots to ensure all students have access to computer hardware and connectivity.

3. Equitable Services Assurances

Participating Private Schools will use the funds for Contracted Cleaning Services, Sanitizing and Cleaning Supplies, Training for Staff on Sanitation, Items for Preparedness and Response Efforts, Educational Technology. Meetings were held on 6/2/2020, 6/3/2020, 6/9/2020, and 6/10/2020 with the Private Schools to ensure a meaningful and good understanding of the CARES Act ESSER Funds-- as noted on their respective Equitable Services Implementation Form. The Private Schools propose to use the funds beginning 8/1/2020 to 4/29/2021.

OTHER ASSURANCES AND CERTIFICATIONS

4. Other Assurances and Certifications

The LEA Superintendent or his/her authorized representative assures or certifies the following:

- The LEA that receives ESSER funds will, to the greatest extent practicable, continue to compensate its employees and contractors during the period of any disruptions or closures related to COVID-19 in compliance with Section 18006 of Division B of the CARES Act. In addition, LEAs that accept funds will continue to pay employees and contractors to the greatest extent practicable based on the unique financial circumstances of the LEA. 5. Section 442 of the General Education Provisions Act Assurances

(a) Each local educational agency which participates in an applicable program under which Federal funds are made available to such agency through a State agency or board shall submit to such agency or board a general application containing the assurances set forth in subsection (b). The application shall cover the participation by that local educational agency in all such programs.

(b) The general application submitted by a local education agency under subsection (a) shall set forth assurances

(1) that the local educational agency will administer each program by the application in accordance with all applicable statutes, regulations, program plans, and applications;

(2) that the control of funds provided to the local educational agency under each program, and title to property acquired with those funds, will be in a public agency and that a public agency will administer those funds and property;

(3) that the local educational agency will use fiscal control and fund accounting procedures that will ensure proper disbursement of, and accounting for, Federal funds paid to that agency under each program;

(4) that the local educational agency will make reports to the State agency or board and to the Secretary as may reasonably be necessary to enable the State agency or board and the Secretary to perform their duties and that the local educational agency will maintain such records, including the records required under section 443, and provide access to those records, as the State agency or board or the Secretary deem necessary to perform their duties;

(5) that the local educational agency will provide reasonable opportunities for the participation by teachers, parents, and other interested agencies, organizations, and individuals in the planning for and operation of each program;

(6) that any application, evaluation, periodic program plan or report relating to each program will be made readily available to parents and other members of the general public;

(7) that in the case of any project involving construction -

(A) the project is not inconsistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities, and

(B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;

(8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and

(9) that none of the funds expended under any applicable program will be used to acquire equipment (including computer software) in any instance in which such acquisition results in a direct financial benefit to any organization representing the interests of the purchasing entity or its employees or any affiliate of such an organization.

(c) A general application submitted under this section shall remain in effect for the duration of the program it covers. The State agencies or boards administering the programs covered by the application shall not require the submission or amendment of such application unless required by changes in Federal or State law or by other significant change in the circumstances affecting an assurance in such application.

6. Section 427 of the General Education Provisions Act Assurances

(a) The purpose of this section is to assist the Department in implementing the Department's mission to ensure equal access to education and to promote educational excellence throughout the Nation, by -

(1) ensuring equal opportunities to participate for all eligible students, teachers, and other program beneficiaries in any project or activity carried out under an applicable program; and

(2) promoting the ability of such students, teachers, and beneficiaries to meet high standards.

(b) The Secretary shall require each applicant for assistance under an applicable program (other than an individual) to develop and describe in such applicant's application the steps such applicant proposes to take to ensure equitable access to, and equitable participation in, the project or activity to be conducted with such assistance, by addressing the special needs of students, teachers, and other program beneficiaries in order to overcome barriers to equitable participation, including barriers based on gender, race, color, national origin, disability, and age.

(c) The Secretary may establish criteria and provide technical assistance for meeting the requirements of this section.

(d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to alter in any way the rights or responsibilities established under the laws cited in section 400(d) of this Act.




