UPDATED INFORMATION: STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO RECEIVE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR DIGITAL LITERACY AND COMPUTER SCIENCE

Montgomery, Ala. – At its monthly K-12 meeting on Thursday, September 13, 2018, the Alabama State Board of Education received recommendations for adoption of textbooks for Digital Literacy and Computer Science, Grades K-12.

In accordance with the State Textbook Law, §16-36-61, *Code of Alabama*, 1975, notice was given that the recommendations were scheduled for consideration at a public hearing on July 18, 2018, in the auditorium of the Gordon Persons Building located at 50 North Ripley Street in Montgomery.

The State Board of Education is scheduled to vote on the Digital Literacy and Computer Science Textbook Committee's recommendations at the December 13, 2018, Board meeting.
