ALABAMA HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA

English Language Arts – 4 credits to include:

- English 9 • English 10 • English 11 • English 12
- Equivalent/substitute options may include: Advanced Placement/International Baccalaureate/postsecondary courses/SDE-approved courses

Mathematics – 3 credits to include:

- Algebra I or its equivalent/substitute
 - Geometry or its equivalent/substitute
 - Algebra II w/Trigonometry or Algebra II, or its equivalent/substitute
- One credit from:**

Alabama Course of Study: Mathematics or equivalent/substitute courses from Career and Technical Education/Advanced Placement/International Baccalaureate/postsecondary courses/SDE-approved courses

Science – 2 credits to include:

- Biology
 - A physical science (Chemistry, Physics, Physical Science)
- Equivalent/substitute options may include: Career and Technical Education/Advanced Placement/International Baccalaureate/postsecondary courses/SDE-approved courses.

Two credits from:

Alabama Course of Study: Science or equivalent/substitute courses from Career and Technical Education/Advanced Placement/International Baccalaureate/postsecondary courses/SDE-approved courses.

Social Studies – 4 credits to include:

- World History
- United States History I

- United States Government
- Economics

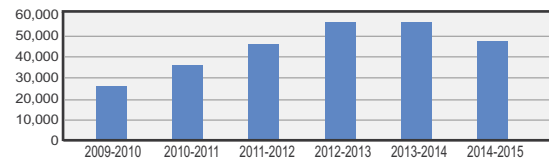
