How does one actually get the CRI?

How long does it take for a student to earn this CRI? (Answer in approximate hours of

 The student will watch a series of training modules and has to successfully complete a quiz following each training module to receive the certification. A score of 80% or higher must be obtained on each quiz for certification. The video series will be supplemental to the teacher led classroom instruction.

- 8. Are students required to be graduates before earning the CRI? No
